Valley D Dominates GU

The Missouri Valley Vikings improved to 4-1 on the season Saturday with a convincing win over the Graceland University Yellow Jackets, 36-12. The Viking defense put in a performance for the ages, limiting GU to just 58 yards of total offense. GU's only two scores in the game came on a defensive fumble return and on a three-play, 17-yard drive after a mishandled punt snap by MVC. The game stats were more lopsided than the score, as Valley put

together 456 yards of total offense, led by junior QB Chris White, who finished the day 15 of 20 passing for 275 yards and a touchdown. Sterling Hardin, Michael Peavy and David Allen each added touchdown runs, part of a 170-yard rushing day for the Vikings. GU running back Jerome Messam, who came into the game as the leading rusher in the HAAC, carried 18 times for 74 yards, but the rest of his offense went backward. Valley defenders tallied eleven tackles for loss and forced a pair of turnovers. GU could manage only 28 yards through the air on 8 of 19 passing. Maurice Peterson and Colin Smith were each credited with six tackles, and 22 different Viking defenders made at least one stop. Valley harassed and hit GU quarterback Scotty Roth, forcing him into an early exit from the game. Graceland averaged just 1.2 yards per play on 47 offensive snaps, compared to 6.2 yards per play for the Vikings.

Valley will travel to Liberty, MO this week to take on the William Jewell College Cardinals. WJC is still in search of their first win of 2009 after dropping to 0-4 with a 42-3 loss at the hands of Central Methodist University. Last season Valley limited Jewell to just 140 total yards in a 44-17 thrashing.

Senior Profile: Jacob Cahill Receiver, H-Back #34 6-0, 222

Jacob Cahill is a versatile and potent offensive weapon for the Vikings. Cahill sees action as both a receiver and fullback. The Odessa, MO native hauled in a 70-yard TD pass against GU and has now caught a touchdown

in three consecutive games. Cahill has eight receptions through the first half of 2009 and four have gone for scores, including the game-winner against Benedictine. Jacob is an Exercise Science major at MVC.
