## **MVC HEAD FOOTBALL COACH ACHEIVES 100TH CAREER WIN**



**Marshall, Mo. (Sept. 27, 2010)** — Missouri Valley College Head Football Coach Paul Troth achieved his 100<sup>th</sup> career win when the Vikings defeated the Culver-Stockton Wildcats on Sept. 11, 2010.

Coach Troth is in his 14th season overall, and is 102-49. He becomes one of 11 active NAIA head coaches with at least 100 wins.

“Coach Troth has done an outstanding job with the Viking football program,” said Tom Fifer, athletic director and vice president of operations. “I commend Coach Troth on this milestone in his career and for the accomplishments that he has made during his tenure at Missouri Valley.”

Coach Paul Troth came to Missouri Valley from Huron University in South Dakota in 2002. In his first year at Missouri Valley, Coach Troth started the season 4-0 and led the Vikings to an 8-2 overall record. The Vikings ended in a three-way tie for second place in the Heart of America Athletic Conference, and cracked the national ratings for the first time in four years.

*American Football Monthly* magazine named Coach Troth the 2002 *Schutt Sports NAIA Coach of the Year*. In 2006, Coach Troth led the Vikings to a 13-1 overall record, an HAAC championship, an NAIA national semifinal playoff game and a final NAIA #3 national ranking. Coach Troth was named *HAAC Coach-of-the-Year* and *American Football Coaches Association Region III Coach-of-the-Year*. In 2007, Coach Troth led the Vikings to a 10-3 overall record and another NAIA national semifinal playoff game and a final NAIA #3 national ranking.

Coach Troth was named *American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Region III Coach-of-the-Year* in 2007. Troth gave much of the credit for his award to his staff and their hard work and overall dedication to the MVC program.

“I have been very fortunate to work with outstanding coaches and talented players throughout my career,” said Coach Troth.

The Vikings are set to take on the Graceland Yellowjackets this Saturday in Lamoni, Iowa.
