Valley Routs CSC

Missouri Valley improved to 7-2 Saturday with a blowout win over the Culver-Stockton Wildcats, 59-7. The Vikings rolled up 581 yards of offense and limited CSC to just 143 total yards. The MVC defense held Culver to minus-sixteen rushing yards and sacked the Wildcat QBs four times. The MoVal D logged ten tackles for loss and created two turnovers. Valley scored touchdowns on each of its first four offensive possessions, with three TD runs by Robert Holmes and one by Junior Allen. The MVC defense found the end zone when cornerback Corey Anderson intercepted a Wildcat pass and raced down the sideline. Anderson lost control of the football after a 50-yard runback, but Maurice Peterson jumped on the loose ball in the end zone for the score. Leading 35-0 after halftime, the Valley defense forced a fumble on Culver's

third play of the second half, then Chris White hit Javion Jones two plays later on a 44-yard touchdown throw. Jones tallied 111 receiving yards on four catches. Backup QB Paul Wayne Thomas threw his first career touchdown pass to junior TE Scott Humphrey in the third quarter to make

the score 49-0, and the second-team offense put together an impressive ten-play, 89-yard drive in the fourth quarter that ended in Junior Allen's second TD rush of the day. Freshman Linebacker Adam Maher made ten total tackles, and kicker Adrian Trevino connected on all nine of his kicks (eight P.A.T.'s and a 29-yard field goal) earning HAAC Conference Defensive and Special Teams Players of the Week, respectively.

The victory puts MVC in position to advance to a third straight post-season, but only if the Vikings can win their final game of the regular season, on the road at #7-ranked Lindenwood University in St. Charles, MO. LU is 8-1, riding an eight game winning streak after dropping their first game of the season. Kickoff is set for 1:30 p.m. Saturday.

#3 Jonathan Nunez WR Bakersfield, CA

Jon Nunez is an athletic and physical weapon at receiver for the Viking offense. The 6'2", 185-pounder is also a productive blocker in the MVC run game. Jon has 29 career receptions for the Vikings, averaging 14.4

yards per catch with four touchdowns. A Native of Bakersfield, CA, Nunez played at Bakersfield Community College before arriving at Valley. Jon is an Exercise Science major at Missouri Valley.
