Vikings Upset by Baker

The Missouri Valley Vikings fell to 6-2 Saturday at the hands of the Baker University Wildcats, 26-22 in Baldwin City, KS. Baker quarterback Mack Brown threw three touchdown passes to Tyrell Spain, the final one a 23-yarder with eight seconds remaining in the game to give BU the lead and the win. MVC controlled the line of scrimmage all game, rushing for 224 yards and allowing Baker just 48 yards on the ground. Valley had a considerable edge in total offense and time-of-possession, but failed to convert numerous scoring opportunities. Baker took a 13-0 lead in the first half on two TD's from Brown to Spain, but Valley battled back with a nine-yard scoring run by Robert Holmes and a 55-yard touchdown pass from Chris White to Javion Jones to take a 14-13 lead. BU connected on a 28-yard field goal on the final play of the first half to take a 16-14 lead at the break. An eight-play drive by

MVC to start the second half ended in an unsuccessful field goal attempt, then Baker kicker Derek Doerfler connected on a 51-yarder to give BU a 19-14 lead. The Vikings again drove 44 yards on twelve plays, but stalled at the Baker 26 and didn't convert the field goal attempt. In the fourth quarter MVC drove 69 yards for the go-

ahead touchdown, a twelve-yard run by Robert Holmes, and converted a two-point play on a pass from White to Jacob Cahill. Holmes ran the ball 40 times on the day for 196 yards and two TD's. Up 22-19, the Vikings held Baker three-and-out, then appeared ready to put the game away when they faced a fourth-and one at the BU ten yard-line. Holmes appeared to have a first down, but the ball was spotted short of the marker and BU took over. The teams exchanged punts, then BU took possession with 1:20 remaining and no time-outs. Baker put together an eight play, 82-yard drive that ended with Spain's catch in the end zone. Baker improves to 7-1 in conference play with the win. The Vikings take on Culver-Stockton College Saturday at 1:30 p.m., needing to close out the season with two wins to keep their post-season hopes alive.

#84 Javion Jones WR Dallas, TX

Javion Jones has had a stellar career at MVC, and is one of the top deep-threat receivers in NAIA football. A dangerous punt-return man as well, Javion has 76 catches for 1,441 yards and 16 TD's as a Viking. Jones averages over 22 yards per reception on 26

catches this season, with eight touchdowns. Saturday against Baker Jones recorded five grabs for 126 yards and a TD. Javion is also a two-time national qualifier for the MVC track team. Javion is a double-major in Exercise Science and Recreation Admin. at MVC.
