PERIODICAL GUIDES & ONLINE RESOURCES (electronic databases)

Periodicals exist in many forms: their original paper form, bound materials, on microfiche, on microfilm, or in an online resource. The printed Political Science related periodicals are housed in the Periodical Room located on the second floor of the Main Library. Microfiche and Microfilm are found in the Multimedia Room. Online resources can be accessed via the Library's web page. These online resources have both abstracts and some Full-Text articles that you can read online, print, or e-mail.

Begin your search for a journal or magazine article by looking in the periodical indexes (across from the Periodicals) or in the online resources. Then check the List of Full Text Journals or the Quest online catalog for the exact location of the periodicals needed.
