Dalibor did not respond to four notices from the library, two phone calls and two letters.

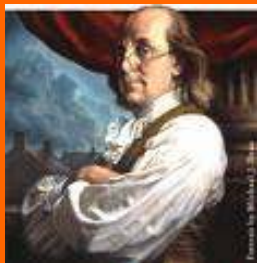
The library forwarded the case to police,
