

Bachelor of Arts in Music

The BA in Music is designed for students who want a broader music curriculum. Students must declare and audition on their primary instrument, which can be any standard band or orchestral instrument, piano, or voice. Each semester, music majors must take applied music lessons for their instrument or voice and are required to participate in a music ensemble.
